We have multiple mentoring programs suitable for a variety of volunteer schedules/commitment

levels.

We are also open with a Drop-In Centre in Wallaceburg, open Fri-Mon 2pm-6pm. Our goal is to build relationships of trust and respect, and begin to build bridges with them to work towards reconnection with social services and organizations in our community. We go out with basic needs (food, hygiene, etc), harm reduction, and basic first aid. We are also equipped with information for many partner organizations if people are indicating they are ready. We also have other programming available to all who need it, including health card replacement, peer program, onsite nursing (James St).
